


Dean's Message

The College of Pharmacy has been fortunate to receive two substantial external grants this Fall. One of only 8 Colleges of Pharmacy nationwide to obtain funding from Cardinal Health, SWOSU received \$125,000 to support student scholarships. We also received \$50,000 from NACDS to support the establishment of a community pharmacy residency program with Walgreens. Largely due to the efforts of Dr. Nancy Williams, SWOSU was one of only 15 Colleges of Pharmacy nationwide to receive funding.

Technology continues to be an area of emphasis for the College. Laptop computers are now required for students to complete their academic course work. We have purchased an electronic medical records program so that all students can utilize electronic medical records as part of their professional training at SWOSU. Additionally, students can now access a variety of e-textbooks through the Access Pharmacy Library Resource program, which should cut down on textbook costs. Video conferencing and video lecturing systems are now in place and utilized on a regular basis.

We are looking forward to beginning our rural health initiative in the spring of 2013. Our goal is to make this a Center of Excellence at the College of Pharmacy. Randy G. Curry, D.Ph., was recently hired by the College to lead this program. Furthermore, our first cohort of combined degree PharmD/MBA students were admitted this fall. Over the next several years, we also hope to establish a number of both community and institutional residencies.

It is an exciting time to be a part of SWOSU College of Pharmacy. While we embark on new initiatives, we never lose sight of our foundation values: excellent teaching, personal attention to students, integrity, innovation, and professionalism.

The main office for our department is based at the Pasteur Medical Building, which is located across from St. Anthony Hospital in Oklahoma City. We recently moved into a larger space in this medical building, almost doubling our previous size. We would love for you to stop by and visit our newly remodeled area.

The 19 faculty in our department have been very busy this fall semester. Along with the didactic teaching and experiential education components, they have been busy working on projects, committee responsibilities, giving presentations, and getting ready for our upcoming accreditation evaluation in February 2014.

I have one last bit of exciting news to share. SWOSU will be starting our first community pharmacy residency program in July 2013! In late September, the National Association of Chain Drug Stores (NACDS) Foundation announced that SWOSU College of Pharmacy, in partnership with Walgreens, was the recipient for one of 15 Community Pharmacy Residency Expansion Project grants in the amount of \$50,000. Our joint program will be located at the Walgreens Health System Pharmacy in the medical office building connected to St. Anthony Hospital in Oklahoma City.




Faculty and students from Southwestern Oklahoma State University's College of Pharmacy in Weatherford recently provided health screenings to over 140 employees at the AT&T facility in Oklahoma City. Screening for potential heart disease and diabetes through a series of tests, the services included: cholesterol screenings, blood glucose (sugar) screenings, blood pressure screenings, and body mass index (BMI) measurements. These skills, plus immunization training, are part of the overall curriculum for our pharmacy students.



Research and scholarly activity are important components of the faculty and student experience at the SWOSU College of Pharmacy. A number of faculty are currently engaged in either independent or collaborative research projects that are relevant to pharmacy practice and the pharmaceutical sciences.

Pharmacy students have research opportunities through enrollment in classes with specific research objectives or through employment by the university as a research assistant. Research results are frequently published in journals or in the form of poster presentations at state, regional and national symposiums and meetings. Through participation in research projects, students have been given opportunities to explore drug development, dosage form design and dissolution properties, pharmacogenomics, natural products, drug synthesis and analysis, and drug regulatory issues.



Region 6 of the APhA-ASP consists of pharmacy colleges and schools in the states of Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas.

As the coordinator, Foster's duties include organizing and putting on the regional meeting for 2013 to be held in Oklahoma City, attending an organizational meeting and a leadership institute in Washington, DC, and attending another organizational meeting in Los Angeles.

SWOSU College of Pharmacy recently received a \$125,000 gift from Cardinal Health as part of the company's pharmacy scholarship program.
Southwestern was one of only eight universities across the nation to receive the award.

The pharmacy school was selected to participate in the Cardinal Health Pharmacy Scholarship Program in 2012 because of its commitment to advancing the independent pharmacy profession. The college offers curricula focused on operating an independent pharmacy; supports a student-run chapter of the National Community Pharmacists Association (NCPA); and demonstrates high post-graduate placement rates in community.




