
SWPhA Wins National Diabetes Award

Southwestern Oklahoma State University's College of Pharmacy SWPhA recently won the National Operation Diabetes Award for the most outstanding project at the annual meeting of the American Pharmacists Association in Orlando, Florida.

The award was presented to the Southwestern chapter of the American Pharmacists Association Academy of Student Pharmacists by Gary Hall, Jr., a three-time Olympian and 10-time Olympic medalist in swimming. SWOSU faculty co-sponsor Dr. Nina Morris said the presentation was a special one for the students. Hall has type one diabetes and has been a hero to patients with diabetes and swimmers worldwide. Janet Seratte of Duncan, who served as club president during the 2004-05 school year, was in charge of the project. The other faculty co-sponsor is Dr. Shelly Prince.

Operation Diabetes is designed to increase awareness of diabetes and the dangers associated with the disease, provide glucose screening and monitoring, and promote pharmaceutical care in the community. The goal is not to diagnose diabetes but rather to provide information to the public in order for people to become more knowledgeable about the disease and to be able to recognize signs and symptoms of diabetes.
